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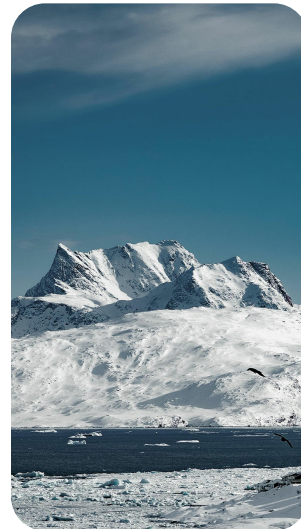

Itinerary

DAY 1: ARRIVAL IN MANIITSOQ AND BOARDING

Upon arrival, there will be time for last-minute shopping and an initial meeting with the local team. Embark on the Southern Star, our sailboat, which will be our home and base of operations during the expedition. Informational briefing and welcome dinner as we begin sailing toward the fjord area.

DAY 2 TO 7: SKI TOURING IN ETERNITY FJORD

Each day will begin with a briefing and safety review before disembarking in a speedboat. We'll set out on a ski touring day in different sectors selected by the guides according to snow and weather conditions. We'll explore mountains that drop steeply into the sea, with routes that allow skiing all the way to the beach. Around midday, there will be a picnic-style break in the wilderness.

In the afternoon we will return to the Southern Star, where a hot appetizer awaits us, the option of a polar dip (2–3°C), and scenic sailing along the Greenlandic coast en route to the next sector. Each night the chef will prepare dinners using local ingredients.

DAY 8: FAREWELL

Final breakfast on board before disembarkation. Transfer to Maniitsoq airport for the return flight to Copenhagen.

Payment and cancellation policy

Initial deposit: To secure your place, a 50% deposit of the total trip cost is required at the time of booking.

Final payment: The remaining 50% must be paid no later than 90 days before departure.

Extras: Additional costs such as insurance, flights, or optional services must be paid in full at the time of booking.

Cancellation insurance: Customers can purchase a cancellation insurance policy to recover the total amount paid (subject to the insurer's terms and conditions).

Travellers may withdraw from the trip and are entitled to a refund of the amounts paid, except for the penalties listed below. Once the trip is confirmed, the client must also pay the cancellation fees. If the trip is cancelled due to insufficient participants, the client may keep the credit for future trips or request a full refund.

SPECIAL cancellation policy:

FULL REFUND WITHIN 24H OF PURCHASE

Up to 90 days before departure: 100% refund

Less than 90 days: no refund will be issued

- €350 administration fee applies
- No refund for already issued bookings. Any other non-refundable issued costs will also be deducted
- Cancellation of issued flights: 100% non-refundable.

Packing List

Ski equipment

Your gear: skis/splitboard, poles, ski boots, climbing skins, and helmet (optional).

- Ski crampons and/or boot crampons (mandatory and essential for splitboarders).
- Ski bag and boot bag (mandatory).
- Avalanche safety gear in a backpack: shovel, probe, transceiver/DVA (mandatory).
- We don't usually plan routes that require ice axes, boot crampons, ropes or harnesses — but you can bring them if you wish (unless it's a private group requesting it).

Sailing gear

Rubber boots and a waterproof jacket are recommended.

Other recommended/essential items for this trip, besides your ski gear:

- Backpack (20–35 litres) with ski carry straps.
- Socks
- Ski touring trousers.
- Thermal shirt (base layer).
- Fleece or similar mid-layer.
- Gore-Tex or similar jacket and trousers (outer layer).
- Lightweight primaloft or down jacket.
- Neck warmer.
- Light gloves (fleece) and warm gloves.
- Beanie for the cold and cap for the sun.
- Sunglasses and ski goggles.
- Headlamp
- Water bottle or thermos (min. 1 litre). If using a Camelbak, note the hose may freeze — consider carrying a spare bottle.
- Sunscreen and lip balm.
- Snacks (bars, gels, nuts...) for the mountain outings.
- Optional: spare batteries, camera, power bank, small first aid kit.

The boat is equipped with 220V “EU” outlets to charge phones and cameras while sailing.

FAQs

What level of experience is required?

Previous ski touring experience and good physical condition are required; the tours are designed for intermediate/advanced levels, with guides who adapt the routes to the group. It is not suitable for people without experience.

How do you get to Maniitsoq?

The most common way to reach Maniitsoq is by flying via Copenhagen. From there, Air Greenland operates domestic flights with possible stopovers in Nuuk or Kangerlussuaq. It is recommended to plan for an overnight stay in Copenhagen at the beginning and end of the trip to ensure smooth connections. Our team can help you arrange tickets and secure the best combination of flights from your nearest airport, with an optional flight search and booking service.

What is life on board like?

Life on the boat is social and dynamic: you'll take part in manoeuvres, cooking, cleaning, and watch duties. Water is limited, showers are not always available, but swimming in the sea is allowed; the atmosphere is intimate and team-spirited.

What is the accommodation like?

The Southern Star is an exclusive sailboat reserved for the group, specially designed to navigate Greenland's waters. With six double guest cabins, relaxation areas, a large exterior deck and a fully equipped ski room, it offers all the comfort needed for a polar expedition. It is fitted with modern communication, navigation and safety technology, and its resident captain has an in-depth knowledge of the region. On board you won't have to worry about a thing: cooking, cleaning and maintenance are included so you can focus solely on enjoying the trip.

Who will be the main guide for the trip?

The main guide will be Jordi Tosas, a renowned UIAGM guide with extensive experience in Arctic and high mountain expeditions. His deep knowledge of the terrain and leadership in extreme conditions ensure a safe, enriching, and memorable experience for all participants.

What is the food like, and are there any special restrictions?

The menu is healthy and boat-friendly, with food available throughout the day, including snacks. If anyone has allergies or special dietary needs, meals can be adapted with prior notice; depending on the itinerary, visiting restaurants on land is also possible.

What is the ski area like in Maniitsoq and the Eternity Fjord?

The ski area around Maniitsoq and Eternity Fjord is an Arctic paradise, with mountains dropping straight to the sea, active glaciers, and spectacular scenery. It's a remote region with no tourist infrastructure, which guarantees a wild, authentic skiing experience. The terrain is highly varied and allows routes to be adapted to the group's level, with runs that finish on beaches accessible from the Southern Star. The polar light, icebergs floating nearby, and the absolute silence of the Arctic turn every day of skiing into an unforgettable experience.

How does a typical day during the expedition look like?

Each morning begins with a safety briefing and a short ride on a speedboat to the day's chosen mountain sector. Routes are selected daily by the guide team based on weather and snow conditions. Expect ski tours that descend all the way to the sea, followed by a picnic lunch in the wild. In the afternoon, you return to the Tulu, enjoy a warm snack, and sail to a new area while soaking in epic Arctic scenery. Dinners on board feature local products and a relaxed, communal atmosphere.

Can I extend the trip or stay longer in Greenland?

Yes. While the ski program is fixed to 8 days, we can help you organize extra nights in Copenhagen or Greenland, depending on flight schedules and your preferences. If you'd like to stay longer, explore Nuuk or even add a second week of adventure — our team will assist with all the arrangements.

What are the passport requirements?

You must have a valid passport with at least 6 months' validity to travel. EU citizens must carry a passport to enter Greenland; national ID cards are not accepted.
