Itinerary

DAY 1 - ARRIVAL IN BUENOS AIRES

Upon arrival at Ezeiza International Airport, one of our local guides will be waiting to welcome you and accompany you on a private transfer to your hotel in Palermo, one of the capital's most vibrant neighborhoods.

You will have the rest of the day free to rest after your flight or take a stroll among cafes, art galleries, and tree-lined parks that showcase the city's youthful energy.

Incluye: Traslado privado aeropuerto – hotel con guía local.

Accommodation: Hotel in Buenos Aires.

DAY 2 – BUENOS AIRES → BARILOCHE: Welcome to Patagonia

In the morning, at the appointed time, a driver will pick you up at your hotel and take you to Buenos Aires domestic airport. After a morning flight to Patagonia, you will land in Bariloche, a city surrounded by lakes and mountains.

Upon arrival at Bariloche airport, one of our local guides will be waiting to welcome you and accompany you on a private transfer to your hotel.

After checking in, you will have the afternoon free to explore the city and its surroundings. You can start your adventure with a gentle trek to Cerro Llao Llao (not included), through forests of lenga and coihue trees. From the top, the viewpoints offer breathtaking panoramic views of Lake Moreno and Cerro López, the perfect introduction to the Patagonian landscape.

Includes: private transfer Hotel Buenos Aires / Aeroparque, private transfer with local guide Bariloche Airport / Hotel.

Alojamiento: Hotel en Bariloche.

Comidas: desayuno.

DAY 3 – BARILOCHE: Agujas del Catedral Trek (Refugio Frey)

The day begins at the base of Cerro Catedral, Bariloche's most renowned ski resort. The trail starts with a flat stretch of about 6 km along Lake Gutiérrez, before entering a forest of lenga trees. As we advance, the terrain slopes and we cross the Van Titter stream, then continue climbing among lower trees and rocks that herald the arrival of the high mountains.

The last stretch is more demanding: 3 km of climbing over rocky terrain, with increasingly close views of the imposing Agujas del Cerro Catedral. Finally, we reach the Emilio Frey Refuge, located next to Toncek Lagoon, surrounded by a natural amphitheater of granite peaks that seem to guard the landscape. A mythical place for hikers and climbers in Patagonia.

Technical details: 9.6 km – 701 m elevation gain – 7/8 hours – moderate difficulty.

Includes: private excursion with mountain guide, box lunch, Nahuel Huapi National Park entrance fee.

Accommodation: Hotel in Bariloche Meals: breakfast + lunch (box lunch).

DAY 4 – BARILOCHE: Free Day

Free day to choose your own adventure. You can relax at the hotel, stroll around the city, or sign up for optional activities. Among the most recommended are the Circuito Chico with its iconic viewpoints, a boat trip on Lake Nahuel Huapi to discover hidden islands and beaches, rafting on the Manso River, or even horseback riding on the steppe. A flexible day to connect with the Patagonian rhythm.

Accommodation: Hotel in Bariloche. Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 5 – BARILOCHE → EL CHALTEN: Heading to Fitz Roy

In the morning, at the appointed time, a driver will pick you up at your hotel and take you to Bariloche airport, where you will board a flight to El Calafate. Upon arrival, a regular bus will take you to your hotel in El Chaltén, the national trekking capital. During the trip, the landscapes open up with infinite horizons and, on clear days, the imposing silhouette of Fitz Roy appears on the horizon. Arrival at the hotel and free afternoon to acclimatize.

Includes: private transfer Bariloche hotel / airport, regular bus El Calafate airport / El Chaltén hotel.

Accommodation: Hotel in El Chaltén. Meals: breakfast.

DAY 6 – EL CHALTEN: Trekking to Laguna Torre

The day begins in El Chaltén, where you will meet your guide and the rest of the group to start the classic and most iconic of the trails: the trek to Laguna Torre.

The first part of the hike climbs gently until reaching the Mirador del Cerro Torre, where you will enjoy one of the most beautiful panoramic views of the granite massif and its glaciers. After a short break to admire the landscape, the trail continues for approximately two hours of more accessible walking, always accompanied by forests and glacial valleys.

Finally, you arrive at Laguna Torre, a majestic setting where Cerro Torre, Cordón Adela, and Cerro Solo rise up, with their glaciers descending towards the lagoon. It is a perfect place to stop, have lunch, and enjoy the immensity of Patagonia. The return to El Chaltén is along the same trail.

Technical details: 20 km – + 356 m elevation gain – 7/8 hours – moderate difficulty.

Includes: regular excursion with local guide, box lunch, Los Glaciares National Park entrance fee.

Accommodation: Hotel in El Chaltén. Meals: breakfast + lunch (box lunch).

DAY 7 – EL CHALTEN: Trekking to Laguna de los Tres

The most iconic and spectacular trek in Patagonia. The day begins with a shared transfer from your hotel to the Eléctrico River Bridge, the starting point of the trail. From there, the hike winds its way through forests and viewpoints, with a stop at the Piedras Blancas Glacier, a natural balcony from which to observe its ice tongue.

The route continues to Camp Poincenot, a historic base for mountaineers, from where you can already see the most iconic peaks of the massif: Saint Exupéry, Poincenot, Fitz Roy, Mermoz, and Guillaumet. Once past this point, the most challenging stretch begins: the last kilometer, with a steep slope and rocky terrain, which finally leads to the mythical Laguna de los Tres.

From there, the view is breathtaking: Fitz Roy rises majestically above the turquoise lagoon, offering one of the most stunning views in the mountain world. After a well-deserved rest, the return trip is via an alternative trail that passes by Laguna Capri, another place of great scenic beauty.

Technical details: ~22 km – +864 m elevation gain – 8/9 hours – high difficulty.

Includes: regular excursion with local guide, box lunch, Los Glaciares National Park entrance fee.

Accommodation: Hotel in El Chaltén. Meals: breakfast + lunch (box lunch).

DAY 8 – EL CHALTEN: Free Day

Free day in El Chaltén to enjoy at your own pace. You can hike short, self-guided trails such as Mirador de los Cóndores or Chorrillo del Salto, rent a bike to explore the valley, or simply relax in a café with a view of the mountains.

Accommodation: Hotel in El Chaltén. Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 9 – EL CHALTEN → EL CALAFATE

Return by regular bus to El Calafate. The rest of the day is free to explore on your own. As a suggestion, the Laguna Nimez Reserve is ideal for those who enjoy bird watching and a peaceful walk through the steppe.

Includes: Regular bus El Chaltén hotel / El Calafate hotel.

Accommodation: Hotel in El Calafate. Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 10 – EL CALAFATE: Perito Moreno Glacier

Full-day shared excursion to Perito Moreno Glacier, one of the natural wonders of the world. You will sail along the wall of this ancient glacier and then walk along the walkways that offer different angles of this 60-meter-high ice colossus. With a little luck, you will be able to witness the roar of ice falling into the water.

Includes: regular excursion, local guide, box lunch, Los Glaciares National Park entrance fee.

Accommodation: Hotel in El Calafate. Meals: breakfast + lunch (box lunch).

DÍA 11 – EL CALAFATE → USHUAIA: Canal Beagle

Early in the morning, at the appointed time, a driver will pick you up and take you to Calafate airport, where you will board your flight to Ushuaia, known as “the city at the end of the world.”

Upon arrival, a local guide will be waiting to take you to your hotel. In the afternoon, enjoy a catamaran cruise on the Beagle Channel, observing the historic Les Éclaireurs Lighthouse and colonies of sea lions and birds that inhabit the islets. This is your first contact with the nature of Tierra del Fuego, where the Andes meet the ocean.

Includes: regular transfer El Calafate hotel/airport, regular transfer Ushuaia airport/hotel, regular catamaran excursion, port taxes.

Accommodation: Hotel in Ushuaia. Meals: breakfast.

DAY 12 – USHUAIA: Trekking and Canoeing in Tierra del Fuego

Active exploration day in Tierra del Fuego National Park. A guide will pick you up with the group to head to the park. First, you will walk through sub-Antarctic forests, peat bogs, and lagoons, accompanied by local guides who will share the natural history of the place. Then, the adventure continues in inflatable canoes down the Lapataia River to the bay of the same name, the symbolic end point of the Pan-American Highway. An experience that combines trekking, paddling, and pure nature.

Technical details: 6–7 km – minimal elevation gain – 3 hours trekking + 1.5 hours canoeing – moderate difficulty.

Includes: regular excursion with local guide, lunch, Tierra del Fuego National Park entrance fees.

Accommodation: Hotel in Ushuaia. Meals: breakfast, lunch.

DAY 13 – USHUAIA: Free Day

A day to explore Ushuaia and its surroundings at your leisure. You can book a boat trip to see penguins, go trekking to Laguna Esmeralda, visit the Maritime Museum, or simply stroll along the waterfront facing the Beagle Channel. An opportunity to say goodbye to the south in your own way.

Accommodation: Hotel in Ushuaia. Meals: Breakfast.

DAY 14 – USHUAIA → BUENOS AIRES: Last night in the capital

Free morning in Ushuaia to enjoy the last views of the southernmost tip. Flight to Buenos Aires and private transfer to the hotel in Palermo. Last night in the capital: a Buenos Aires dinner or a tango show are the best ways to end the adventure.

Includes: regular transfer Ushuaia hotel / airport, private transfer Aeroparque / Buenos Aires hotel.

Accommodation: Hotel in Buenos Aires. Meals: breakfast.

DAY 15 – BUENOS AIRES: Departure from Argentina

Private transfer to Ezeiza International Airport for your return flight. End of our services and your journey through the depths of Patagonia.

Includes: private hotel/airport transfer.

Meals: breakfast.

Payment and cancellation policy

Initial Deposit: To secure your place, an initial payment of €600 is required at the time of booking.

Final Payment: The remaining amount must be paid no later than 80 days before the departure date.

Extras: Additional travel costs, such as insurance, flights, or other optional services, must be paid in full at the time of booking.

Cancellation Insurance: The customer may take out travel cancellation insurance in order to obtain a refund of the full amount paid (according to the terms and conditions).

The end user may cancel the trip, with the right to a refund of the amounts paid, except for the penalties indicated, but must also pay the Agency the amounts indicated below once the trip has been confirmed. If the trip does not take place because the minimum number of participants has not been reached, the customer may save the credit for future trips or request a full refund of the reservation.

SPECIAL cancellation policy:

FULL REFUND UP TO 24 HOURS AFTER PURCHASE

- More than 70 days before the trip: the amount paid will be refunded.
- Between 69 and 45 days before the trip: 40% of the total amount will be retained and the rest will be refunded.
- Between 44 and 31 days before the trip: 60% of the total amount will be retained and the rest will be refunded.
- Less than 30 days before the trip: the amount paid will not be refunded.

A €250 administration fee will be charged.

No refunds will be given for cancellations of reservations that have already been issued. If there are other non-refundable expenses that have already been incurred, these will also not be refunded and will be deducted from the amount to be paid.

The cost of canceling issued flights is 100% of the amount.

Packing List

Technical clothing (layers and versatility):

- First layer (skin contact, quick drying):
 - Long-sleeved dry-fit shirts (merino or synthetic, no cotton).
 - Lightweight trekking pants/leggings.
- Second layer (warmth):
 - 1–2 lightweight fleeces or mid layers.
- Extra thermal layer:
 - 1 down or synthetic jacket (lightweight, compressible).
- Outer layer (waterproof):
 - 1 waterproof and breathable hard-shell jacket (minimum 10,000 mm).
 - 1 pair of lightweight waterproof pants.
- Basic accessories:
 - Thermal gloves + thin gloves for layering.
 - Buff/multifunction neck warmer.
 - Thermal hat and visor cap.

Classic mistake: too much warmth and not enough waterproofing. Patagonia is treacherous: rain, wind, and sun all in the same day.

Footwear and feet:

- Trekking boots.
- Lightweight sneakers for the city or breaks.
- Sandals for the hotel and post-trekking optional.
- Technical socks: merino or synthetic, varying thicknesses.
- Thin liner socks to prevent blisters.

Trekking and everyday equipment:

- 30–40L backpack with waterproof cover for outings (days 3, 6, 7, 10, 12).
- Fanny pack/small bag for flights and transfers.
- Trekking poles (foldable, lightweight).
- Water bottles or hydration pack (minimum 1L).
- Sunglasses with UV filter and retention.
- Sunscreen + lip balm with high SPF.
- Headlamp/flashlight with extra batteries.

Hygiene and health:

- Botiquín personal: analgésicos, antiinflamatorios, curitas, vendas, antialérgicos, sales de rehidratación.
- Personal prescription medications (bring a printed prescription).

Documentation and extras:

- Valid passport with 6 months validity + digital/paper copies.
- Mandatory travel insurance (not included in the program).
- Credit cards and some cash in USD/ARS.
- Universal adapter and chargers (220V in Argentina).
- Cell phone + external battery.

FAQs

Is previous mountain experience necessary?

It is not mandatory, but it does help. The treks are guided and follow marked trails. Those with previous experience will enjoy the challenge more.

What is the required physical fitness level?

This program is designed for active travelers who are used to walk for several hours. Technical experience is not required, but good physical condition is recommended, as some days include treks lasting between 6 and 8 hours.

Is travel or rescue insurance mandatory?

Yes, insurance that includes evacuation in the event of an accident is required. We can help you take out a policy.

Do I need a visa to travel to Argentina?

Most travelers do not need a visa. Please contact us to find out the requirements.

What type of accommodation is included in the trip?

You will stay in comfortable hotels with double rooms and private bathrooms. These hotels have been selected for their comfort, location, and service. We offer two alternatives: - With the "Premium" option, you will stay in small, charming hotels with a good breakfast. - With the "Budget" option, the hotels are simpler in terms of service. Camping is not used.

What meals are included?

All breakfasts and five box lunches during excursions. Dinners are not included.

How do I get to the starting point of the trip?

You should fly to Ezeiza International Airport (Buenos Aires). We will pick you up upon arrival.

Are flights included?

Domestic flights within Argentina and international flights are not included in the price. We can quote these separately from the package.

Can I book extra nights before or after the trip?

Yes, we can help you extend your stay in Buenos Aires or other destinations.

What should I bring for trekking?

Essentials: hiking boots, daypack (20–30 L), walking sticks, technical layered clothing, waterproof jacket, hat, gloves, and sunscreen. Patagonian weather can change quickly.

Is there phone or internet coverage during the trip?

In urban areas, yes. During treks, coverage may be non-existent.

Can I bring a suitcase instead of a big backpack?

Yes, transfers are made by vehicle, and you can bring conventional luggage along with a backpack for everyday use.

Is tipping required?

It is not mandatory, but it is customary to tip guides if the service has been satisfactory.

What happens if the weather is unfavorable?

Patagonia is unpredictable. In the event that weather conditions prevent an excursion from taking place, the guides will propose safe alternatives adapted to the group.
