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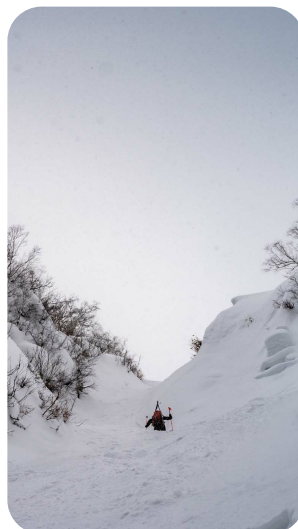
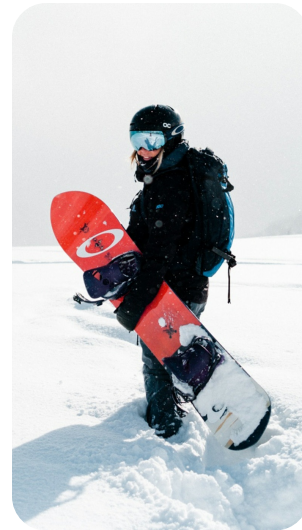

Itinerary

DAY 1: ARRIVAL AND TRANSFER TO THE SKI ACCOMMODATION

Pick-up at Asahikawa Airport, private transfer through a stunning landscape to the lodge. Stop at a Japanese spa (Onsen) to relax. Check-in at the accommodation and briefing with the guide about the week's plan.

DAY 2: DISCOVER "JAPOW"

JAPOW begins — we'll put on our skis early in the morning and explore the best slopes near the lodge. Our local guides will show you "their playground."

DAY 3: SKIING IN KURODAKE

About 20 minutes from the lodge is the iconic Kurodake ropeway, which gives access to one of the best ski areas in all of Hokkaido. We'll choose the best lines depending on the conditions and time of the season.

DAY 4: SKIING AND CULTURE

We'll once again use the Kurodake ropeway to access some of the island's slopes and powder. Later, we'll head to Asahikawa to enjoy a great Japanese dinner and have some drinks at popular local bars.

DAY 5: OFF-PISTE SKIING

We'll head to one of the island's resorts to enjoy multiple runs, tailoring the program to the group's priorities.

We'll head to the highest point in Hokkaido — the Asahidake ropeway. A magical day awaits us on this picturesque mountain.

It's time to say goodbye! Private transfer back to Asahikawa Airport and return flight.

Payment and cancellation policy

Payment and Cancellation Policy

Initial Booking: A 30% deposit of the total trip price is required at the time of booking to secure your spot.

Final Payment: The remaining 70% must be paid no later than 60 days before the departure date.

Extras: Additional costs such as insurance, flights or other optional services must be paid in full at the time of booking.

Cancellation Insurance: Clients can purchase travel cancellation insurance to recover the total amount paid, depending on the policy's terms.

Travelers may cancel and receive a refund of the amounts paid, excluding any applicable penalties. If the trip is canceled due to not meeting the minimum number of participants, the client may keep the credit for future trips or request a full refund.

Cancellation Policy:

- Full refund up to 24 hours after purchase.
- Up to 60 days before departure: 100% refund.
- Up to 45 days before departure: 50% refund.
- Less than 45 days: no refund.

*A €250 management fee applies.

*No refunds will be given for already issued bookings or other non-refundable expenses.

Issued flight tickets are 100% non-refundable.

Equipment list

Ski Equipment

- Your ski gear: skis/splitboard, poles, ski boots, climbing skins, helmet.
- Ski crampons and/or crampons (mandatory and essential for splitboards)
- Ski bag and boot bag (required).
- Avalanche gear in your backpack: shovel, probe, DVA transceiver (mandatory).

Other recommended/necessary items for these trips, in addition to your travel gear:

- Ski Socks.
- Ski touring pants.
- Thermal shirt (base layer).
- Fleece or similar (mid layer).
- Gore-Tex jacket and pants (outer layer).
- Lightweight primaloft or down jacket.
- Neck gaiter.
- Thin fleece gloves and thick gloves.
- Warm hat and sun cap.
- Sunglasses and snow goggles.
- Headlamp
- Water bottle or thermos, minimum 1 liter. If using a Camelbak-style hydration pack, be aware the tube may freeze — bringing an extra bottle is recommended.
- Sunscreen and lip protection.
- Snacks (bars, gels, nuts...) to eat in the mountains during outings.

Optional: spare batteries, camera, power bank, first aid kit.

FAQs

What does the Freeride trip in Hokkaido consist of?

It is a 7-day program with 5 full days of off-piste skiing in the Daisetsuzan National Park, known for its legendary powder, combining lift rides, hikes, and landscapes of forests and glaciers.

Why does Hokkaido offer the best powder in the world?

Thanks to its climate: cold Siberian air currents carry moisture from the Sea of Japan, producing abundant dry snow; consistent temperatures keep it ideal for skiing.

What level of skiing is required?

An intermediate to advanced level is required, with experience in freeride and off-piste skiing: you need to feel confident in deep snow and varied slopes. The group level can be adjusted depending on preference for more freeride or ski touring and the use of ski lifts can vary accordingly. Don't hesitate to contact us so we can assess whether you have the right skiing level.

Where do we stay?

In traditional Japanese lodges, one in Kamikawa and another in Furano. Shared rooms in traditional style (futons); single option available upon request. Experience an authentic Japanese stay. For groups of 6 people you will have the private lodge to yourself.

What elevation gains/losses are skied per day?

Typical descents range from 700 to 1,000 vertical meters, using lifts and approach skiing depending on conditions and group level.

Are the guides local?

Yes, they all live in Hokkaido and speak Japanese, English, and Spanish. They know every area in detail and adapt to the group.

What is the local culture and cuisine like?

The lodge offers delicious breakfast and dinner service. The culinary style is a unique fusion of Japanese cuisine and international flavors, creating a memorable dining experience. You'll enjoy delicious meals lovingly prepared with fresh, local ingredients.

Can the trip be customized?

Yes, it is possible to organize a fully customized experience for private groups of 4 to 6 people. In this format, dates, program duration, skiing level, and daily itineraries can be tailored according to the group's interests and abilities. It is an ideal option for those seeking greater flexibility, a personalized activity pace, and to enjoy Hokkaido powder with total exclusivity.

What type of skis are recommended and is it possible to rent them there?

To fully enjoy the deep powder of Hokkaido, it is recommended to use freeride skis with a minimum waist width of 100 mm, which provide better floatation and control in deep, dry snow. All technical gear can be rented directly at the lodge, including skis, poles, boots, and safety equipment (AVALANCHE transceiver, shovel, probe), so it is not essential to travel with your own equipment.
