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

Itinéraire

DAY 1: Black Beach of Khalaktyrka

Arrival in Kamchatka, transfer to the hotel in Petropavlovsk. Excursion to the Black Beach of the Pacific in Khalaktyrka (travel time 40 minutes) where we will have lunch overlooking the Pacific Ocean. An afternoon on the beach to dip your feet in the ocean after hours of travel. We will have dinner in town before returning to the hotel.

Accommodation: Hotel

DAY 2: Avachinsky Volcano

Transfer to the impressive and active Avachinsky volcano (approximately 2 hours travel) by 4x4 vehicle, where we will take a hike between the Avachinsky and Koryaksky volcanoes. Overnight stay in a mountain cabin featuring a Russian sauna (optional).

Accommodation: Mountain cabin

Meals: breakfast + lunch + dinner

DAY 3: Trekking between volcanoes

Easy morning walk to the "Kamel" viewpoint, a spot where we will have a wonderful view of the two powerful volcanoes Avachinsky and Koryaksky. In the afternoon, transfer by 4x4 vehicle to Paratunka, famous for its hot springs (approximate travel time 2 hours), accommodation and dinner at a hotel with a thermal pool and sauna.

Accommodation: Hotel

Meals: breakfast + lunch + dinner

DAY 4: Yacht excursion in the Pacific Ocean

Transfer by minibus to the port, boat trip along the Pacific coast to Russkaya Bay with opportunities to observe sea lions, whales, seals, and giant sea eagles. On the boat, we will fish and prepare the delicious seafood and fish caught for lunch on board. Overnight and dinner at the same hotel as the previous day.

Accommodation: Hotel

Meals: breakfast + lunch + dinner

DAY 5: Gorely Crater

Transfer by 4x4 jeep to Gorely volcano (approximate travel time 3.5 hours), easy walk on good paths to the crater (comfortable ascent in about 2 hours). Overnight in a glamping dome tent (space for 7 people / double tents with additional charge) near the summit of Vilyuchinsky.

Accommodation: Tent

Meals: breakfast + lunch + dinner

Day 6: Mutnovsky volcano and Opasny waterfall

Transfer by 4x4 jeep to Mutnovskiy volcano (approximately 3 hours travel time), hike to the viewpoint at Mutnovskiy crater and Opasny waterfall. Overnight in a glamorous tent at Viljushinsky Pass as the previous day.

Accommodation: Tent

Meals: Breakfast + Lunch + Dinner

Day 7: Petropavlovsk

Transfer by 4x4 jeep back to the hotel in Petropavlovsk. In the afternoon, city tour and visit to the Volcanarium, the best and most interesting museum in Kamchatka. Overnight at the Petropavlovsk hotel.

Accommodation: Hotel

Meals: breakfast + lunch

DAY 8: Excursion to the Valley of the Geysers by mi-8 helicopter (optional)

Optional one-day Mi-8 helicopter excursion program to observe bears in the Valley of the Geysers / Uzon Caldera (optional excursion price 750 euros per person). Considered one of the most spectacular sites in Kamchatka and home to the highest concentration of bears. If you choose not to take the excursion, an ethnographic program about the indigenous populations (Koryaks, Itelmens, and Evens) with local representatives will be offered. Overnight stay at a hotel in Petropavlovsk.

Accommodation: Hotel

Meals: breakfast + lunch

DAY 9: Return trip

It's time to say goodbye for now! Transfer to the airport to begin your return journey.

Meal: breakfast

Payment and cancellation policy

Initial reservation: To secure your spot, a 30% deposit of the total trip cost is required at the time of booking.

Final payment: The remaining 70% must be paid no later than 90 days before the departure date.

Extras: Additional travel costs such as insurance, flights, and other optional services must be paid in full at the time of booking.

Cancellation insurance: Clients may purchase cancellation insurance to receive a full refund of the amount paid (subject to policy conditions).

The end user may cancel the booked trip and is entitled to a refund of the amounts paid, except for the indicated penalties, but must also satisfy the Agency the amounts indicated below once the trip is confirmed. If the trip is not carried out due to the minimum number of participants not being reached, the client may keep the credit for future trips or request a full refund of the booking.

Cancellation policy 4:

FULL REFUND UP TO 24 HOURS AFTER PURCHASE

Up to 90 days before the trip, 100% refund of the trip cost.

Up to 60 days before the trip, 50% refund of the trip cost.

For shorter periods than those described in the cancellation policy, no refund of the amount already paid will be made.

*Management fees of €350 apply.

*No cancellation fees will be reimbursed on already issued bookings. If there are other non-refundable expenses already issued, these will also not be refunded and will be deducted from the amount to be paid.

*The cost of canceling issued flights is 100%.

FAQs

How to get to Kamchatka from my country?

To get to Kamchatka, it is usual to first fly to Moscow (Russia) and from there take a domestic flight to Petropavlovsk-Kamchatsky Airport (PKC), the main gateway to the peninsula. There are regular flights from Moscow lasting approximately 8-9 hours. Alternatively, in certain seasons there are also connections via Beijing. We recommend checking the most convenient options depending on your country of origin and booking in advance due to the limited flight frequency.

What level of physical activity is required?

This trip includes trekking, 4x4 transfers, boats, and helicopter rides, but it is designed for all levels and does not require exceptional physical fitness. Since most of these trips are done privately, we can adapt them to your specific needs and requirements.

What is the accommodation like during the trip?

Accommodation in hotels in Petropavlovsk and Paratunka, a mountain cabin with sauna in the volcano area, and stays in a refuge or on a boat, depending on the day.

What are the means of transportation?

The trip combines 4x4 jeeps, speedboats or yachts along the Pacific, and private transfers, ensuring comfort and access to remote locations. Optional extra day by helicopter available.

Are the trips to Kamchatka group or private?

Most of our expeditions to Kamchatka are private trips, available for groups of 2 or more people and fully customizable on any summer date. They are guided by our local guide Elena, an expert in the region who speaks English, Spanish, and Russian fluently, ensuring a close, safe, and enriching experience both naturally and culturally.

What is the weather like in Kamchatka during the summer?

In summer, temperatures range between 15°C and 20°C, with a humid climate but ideal for outdoor activities.

Can the itinerary be customized?

Yes, the program is adaptable: the 9-day itinerary covers the south and can be customized. We also offer a longer program in the region: KAMCHATKA SOUTH AND CENTER, LAND OF FIRE (14 days).

What are the differences between the 9-day and 14-day trips in Kamchatka?

The 9-day program is designed for those seeking an intense but shorter experience: it focuses on the southern Kamchatka area, including the Avachinsky volcano, the Pacific coast, wildlife spotting, and hot springs. In contrast, the 14-day trip is a more comprehensive adventure that, in addition to the south, includes the central peninsula with active volcanoes like Tolbachik, 4x4 journeys through unique volcanic landscapes, and more days of trekking in the wild nature of the peninsula's central region.

Do I need a visa to travel to Kamchatka?

Yes, and the good news is that citizens from many countries can obtain a Russian e-Visa quickly and easily online. This electronic visa allows a single entry, is valid for up to 16 days in the country, and can be processed online within minutes if you meet the requirements. You only need a valid passport and to complete the form on the official Russian Ministry of Foreign Affairs website.

What is the best season to take this trip?

The summer months (June to September) are the most recommended for exploring Kamchatka, each with its own charm: June: melting landscapes, fewer tourists, and wildflowers. Some areas still inaccessible. July: ideal weather, bear activity in the rivers, and excellent for hiking and helicopter rides. August: the warmest month, perfect for volcanoes and rafting, though with possible rain. September: autumn begins, colorful landscapes, and fewer visitors, but more variable weather.
